The Tale of the Three Trees

The story is told of three trees that once stood on a peaceful hillside. As they grew, each tree cherished a special dream.

The first dreamed of holding the greatest treasure in the world.
The second dreamed of becoming a magnificent ship that would carry mighty kings across the seas.

The third dreamed of growing tall and pointing every heart toward heaven.

In time, the trees were cut down and turned into lumber. It seemed as though their dreams had been lost—but in remarkable ways, each one was fulfilled.

The first tree was shaped into a simple feeding trough. On a silent night in Bethlehem, it became the manger that held the greatest treasure of all—baby Jesus.

The 12 Days of Christmas

We all know the familiar song about the twelve days of Christmas and the gifts given by “my true love.” But there is a deeper meaning behind these verses. Throughout history, the song has also been used as a way to remember key teachings of the Bible and important Christian practices.

For our light display, we combined the lyrics of the song with their traditional biblical symbolism. Here is the meaning behind each day:

Days of Christmas Biblical Meaning

Day 1 – A Partridge in a Pear Tree Jesus Christ on the Cross

Day 2 – Two Turtle Doves The Old and New Testaments

Day 3 – Three French Hens The three virtues: Faith, Hope, and Charity (1st Corinthians 13:13)

Day 4 – Four Calling Birds The Four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John

Day 5 – Five Golden Rings The first five books of the Bible (the Pentateuch): Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy

Day 6 – Six Geese a-Laying The six days of Creation (Genesis 1)

Day 7 – Seven Swans a-Swimming The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit–Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord (Isaiah 11:2–3)

Day 8 – Eight Maids a-Milking The Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12)

Day 9 – Nine Ladies Dancing The Fruit of the Spirit–Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-Control (Galatians 5:22-23)

Day 10 – Ten Lords a-Leaping The Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17)

Day 11 – Eleven Pipers Piping The eleven faithful disciples: Simon Peter, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, Matthew, James (son of Alphaeus), Simon the Zealot, and Thaddaeus

Day 12 – Twelve Drummers Drumming The twelve points of the Apostles’ Creed



The Nativity

We chose to keep the Nativity simple, allowing its message to shine clearly. The true power of Christmas lies in Christ coming to earth as a baby—a humble arrival that changed the world and gives meaning to the entire season. Through these gentle silhouettes, we catch a glimpse of what that first Christmas may have been like: quiet, modest, and awe-inspiring.

Jesus did not arrive with grandeur or spectacle. Instead, He came in the humblest of ways, choosing to become one of us so that He might save us and bring us back to God.
